SUMMARY

Mango is an online language learning resource with over 70+ different languages. Mango's unique teaching method quickly engages you in real conversations between two native speakers.

ACCESS

Go to the Salt Lake County Library's Language Learning databases at www.thecountylibrary.org/languages. From the list available, select: Mango Languages. This will open a new window. You can use Mango as a guest, but your progress will not be saved. To create an account click on the "Sign Up" button, enter your email address, library card number, and a password. Once you've created an account, you can download and install the free Mango app on your mobile device from your preferred app store.

LOGIN

Open the Mango app (or open Mango in a browser) and login with the email address and password you used to create your Mango account.

CHOOSE A LANGUAGE

Once you have logged in with your Mango account, you can choose which language you would like to learn. If you don't see the language you are interested in under the "Popular Languages" section, try typing in the language you are looking for. You can also click on the "See All" button, or simply scroll, to see the 70+ languages available.

Start Learning

Start at the beginning or take a Placement quiz. Click on Support for additional help.

Along the top of the screen, you will see a toolbar with four tabs.

Learn: Shows your learning pathway. The Main Units contain the Mango Conversations lessons (designed to teach language through conversation), Reading and Listening lessons (designed to increase a learner's familiarity with the material learned in the conversations courses), and Recap lessons (to help you review the contents).

Specialty courses follow the same methodology found in the Main courses, but focus on specialty topics, cultural events, and unique cultural aspects of a language. Not all language courses contain Specialty courses.

Vocabulary: Includes vocabulary cards to aid in memorization (not yet available for all languages).

Explore: Connects you with features that will stretch your language skills and expand your cultural horizons (not yet available for all languages).

Tools: Translates the basis of a conversation between two different languages.
