





Highlights

Storytime to go backpacks in Spanish

The County Library expanded the Storytime to Go backpacks to include Spanish-language materials thanks to funding from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS). This funding was provided through the Library Services and Technology Act and administered by the Utah State Library Division. Storytime to Go backpacks contain activities, toys, books, and songs designed for families to share learning with little ones.

All-Star Winter Reading

In February 2023, the NBA All-Star game came to Salt Lake City, and the County Library had a unique opportunity through the Salt Lake County Mayor's Office to collaborate with the Utah Jazz and create a basketball-themed Winter Reading program. This special theme and promotion resulted in double the usual Winter Reading participation and a mascot meet-and-greet for finishers.

OWL Camp

Tweens and teens came together for OWL Campthe County Library's annual STEAM summer camp with a wizarding theme. Through collaborations with Salt Lake County divisions and community partners, 1,000 kids met mysterious animals, explored the solar system, and created clever concoctions.

Branch Anniversary

The Bingham Creek branch celebrated 25 years by traveling back in time to their opening in 1998. The anniversary party highlighted the late 90s with books, movies, music, and pop culture flashbacks. The Bingham Creek branch welcomes around 11,000 visitors every month, and circulated more than half a million items in 2023.







2023 Library Revenue


